**Music and worship have a lot to do with Revival. - Prof Stuart Piggan. (In the 1904-05 Welsh Revival Evan Roberts hardly said anything. He (just) encouraged his female singers to sing.*

**"There's got to be a hunger. There's got to be prayer." – Pastor Jemima Varughese*

**In 1889, Melbourne minister John MacNeil started prayer meeting with 4 other ministers on Saturday afternoons, & were joined by other denominational ministers praying for "the big revival." Later that year, 700 ministers came to a Day of Prayer. In 1902, when evangelist RA Torrey arrived, thousands were eagerly awaiting an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. At the height, 250,000 (of the region's 1.2million) attended many simultaneous meetings in one night."*
