- "Bishop Carol has done great work in implementing the Ministry Wellbeing & Development Policy Guidelines & Resources... for licenced clergy... We have implemented policies for professional supervision & development, plus extra resourcing for part time & non-stipendiary positions.
- **Bishop Carol** has advised that she will be retiring and concluding her service as Assistant Bishop early in the New Year...we thank God for her and wish her and Jay many years of joyful and fruitful retirement on their beloved South Coast."
- A plan for a co-ordinated national, Parish-Based outreach program of evangelism to be implemented from Easter 2025
- I hope for a Provincial Convention on Evangelism late in 2024.... Either as individuals or a church there is no greater gift than a clear presentation of the good news of Jesus.
- As this gift is shared **God is growing His church in Canberra-Goulburn**.... we have seven church or congregation plants in planning / early launch stages...most outside Canberra.
