

The covers of this book are made from the gold from the jewellery, largely rings, donated by those whose loved ones had died. The book carries the weight of love. In Jesus we encounter such love beyond measure. ***Pray for** those for whom the weight of remembrance is heavy.

"In 2019 the bronze statue of Light Horseman Jack Pollard was unveiled on the shores of Lake Galilee, honouring the 1,000 indigenous troopers who served in Palestine in WW1.

Jack was a man of faith, so in his hand is a New Testament telling the story of the one the world remembers as having laid down his life for both friends and enemies. That carpenter from Nazareth had walked that same ground in Northern Israel.
I was very moved when I saw it. In talking about it with an Aboriginal mate, we both agreed that this sculpture expresses the power of Jesus' self-sacrifice to transcend the pain of any racial prejudice and the horror of any battlefield." – Paul Roe, from his book: Tell Me Another.
