WOW, here's one very special story – may God continue to bless Boorowa Parish!

"Boorowa Parish has stepped out in faith, and introduced some new ministries in their community. Last year, they set up a **recycling program** for their town – collecting plastic bottle caps, bread tags, soft plastics, and blister packs. The **soft plastics** are donated to **REDcycle** who have collection points in major supermarkets. The **plastic bottle lids** are sorted and sent to **Lids4Kids** who granulate the lids and send them to be made into many different and useful items. The **bread tags** are sent to **Aussie Breadtags for Wheelchairs**, who sell them to fund wheelchairs for those who need them in South Africa. **Blister packs** are sent to **Banish**, for recycling by **Terracycle**. The community has embraced the initiative, and are now collecting the lids which they would normally have thrown away.

The parish has a 24-hour collection bin at the front of the hall, and encourages people to bring in their clean, dry and empty lids and plastics at any time. On Tuesday mornings, the community is invited to **bring their lids and stay for a cuppa and cake, at the Recycle Café.**"

When a parishioner suggested that there might be some older people who would like to **play table tennis**, a **table** was set up in the hall, and some advertising went out. The ministry has been so popular, that they soon had to get a **2nd Table Tennis table, and are now advertising for a 3rd**. The group, **Table Tennis for Seniors**, runs every Tuesday at the same time as the **Recycle Café**. It is a casual group who enjoy chatting and laughing together as much as playing Table Tennis....." - Anglican News, April 2021.
