"Israel's war with Hamas is taking a huge toll on businesses dependant on Christian tourists across the Holy Land. Many of them are in the West Bank town of Bethlehem. Hotels, restaurants and souvenir shops are virtually empty with a significant number forced to close or lay off staff... and many Palestinian families in the birthplace of Jesus have no income and some have been left homeless. Christian shop owner, Rony Tabash, is trusting in God to sustain and protect his family through the crisis. Due to the danger in the region, Mr Tabash knows that people can't physically visit Bethlehem, but he urged them to be present in other ways. "Come with your prayers, come with your actions asking for peace, come by
